

HISTORY OF NORTH AMERICAN URSULINE EDUCATIONAL SERVICES: NAUES (UES)

The formal Incorporation of NAUES took place in 1991, after several years of committee work and reports given to the North American Ursuline Leadership Conference (NAULC).

A Board of Trustees, representing Ursuline Congregations who support Ursuline Educational organizations, began its governance of this inter-Ursuline effort, with an Executive Director serving fulltime, furthering the goals and mission of this organization.

The NAUES name was changed to Ursuline Educational Service (UES) in the spring of 2006 by the Board of Trustees of NAUES.

NAUES MISSION STATEMENT:

Ursuline Educational Services is a collaborative effort of Ursuline congregations to carry their educational tradition into the future. In the spirit of Saint Angela Merici, the organization fosters education based on Gospel values. It promotes the preservation and development of the Ursuline charism and mission in Ursuline-sponsored schools and other educational settings.

Services Provided:

Laurel Links: A newsletter for Ursuline Schools published three times a year. This newsletter was begun in 1994.

Website: HYPERLINK "http://www.ursuline-education.com" www.ursuline-education.com was begun in 1999 with links to each school as well as resources available and events information.

Student Service Recognition Program: Initiated in 1992–93 school year, this program showcases student service projects and is made available annually for the Ursuline Schools to share with their school communities. Originally called “Windows on Our Ursuline World,” it later was changed to “Students Making a Difference” and is now

communicated as an email attachment to our Ursuline schools from the Co-Director's office, with a copy of the full description of the projects on the website, under "Publications".

Directory of Ursuline Schools: A Directory of UES was compiled and printed for our Ursuline Schools. It is updated every year or two and is now available as an email attachment which the member schools can download. It is also on the website, under "Publications". The listing includes Ursuline sponsored and affiliated schools from the USA, Canada, and Mexico, as well as a growing list upon request from other countries where there are Ursuline schools interested in collaboration and interconnection.

International Connections: During its twenty years of development, the Ursuline Education Services has grown in global dimensions within the Ursuline Schools' Community. Administrators and Co-workers from Canada, Mexico, Peru, England, Taiwan, Japan, Germany, and other countries have attended conferences and dialogues. In September, 2005, the Administrators' Dialogue was co-hosted by L'Escole des Ursulines de Quebec with the use of two languages, French and English. In August, 2006 Ursuline school Administrators and Co-Workers representing eleven countries and 40 Ursuline schools participated in an Ursuline Education Gathering in Rio de Janeiro, Brazil, using three languages: Portuguese, Spanish, and English. Sister Lois Castillon, while she was Director of UES was a presenter and consultant in Ursuline schools in England, Austria, Taiwan, and South Africa.

The Angela Foundation for Ursuline Education:

The Angela Foundation for Ursuline Education was developed as a grass roots initiative among the Ursuline schools administrators and became a partner with UES in 2000. Originally the foundation had a separate board but since September, 2006, it has been governed by the members of the UES Board of Trustees.

As a participant in the mission of St. Angela Merici, the Angela Foundation for Ursuline Education is committed to providing resources in support of Ursuline education in all its forms. While respecting the uniqueness of each of the Ursuline educational ministries in North America, the foundation seeks to promote the Ursuline Core Values through the establishment of endowment funds.
