For over 25 years, UEN has annually hosted a summer student leadership conference. Focused on high school girls, the conference interfaces UEN directly with students to enhance their leadership skills and illustrates the valuable role of each student in the Ursuline sisterhood. The theme for this years' conference is *Emerging Leader*, geared toward rising Sophomore and Junior students who have not been previously selected to leadership roles at their schools. Each UEN member school is encouraged to send up to four students and one faculty/staff member as a sponsor. The 2022 Conference anticipates some of the attendees to grow their capable leadership skills during the 22-23 school year and return in June of 2023 as Conference students leaders. School adult sponsors willcheck in in with their student attendees throughout the school year to encourage their leadership growth and engagement. Special thanks to Michele Bernot, Director of Campus Ministry for Beaumont High School who chaired the Student Leadership Conference Core Planning Team. The goal of the planning team was to create a conference framework to be passed amongst schools willing to host the conference in future years. UEN also appreciates Ursuline College for hosting the Conference. Founded 130 years ago by Ursuline Sisters of Forest Gate, and currently under the leadership of head teacher Julia Waters, pictured right, the school has been through various phases; from a private boarding school to a voluntary-aided grammar school in 1944, and eventually a 13-18 comprehensive school for girls. In September 2002, Ursuline High School became a sixth-form entry 11-19 comprehensive secondary school. Julia looks forward to participating on the UEN Board of Trustees beginning in the fall of 2022.
